



The Story

The play is set in New England between the years 1873 and 1888 and opens in an Amusement Park. Mullins' Carousel is one of the attractions, not least on account of the handsome Barker, Billy Bigelow. Mrs Mullins, owner of the Carousel notices Billy is attracted to Julie Jordan, one of the girls from Mr. Bascombe's mill and is furious about this. A row ensues and Billy is sacked; Julie also loses her job at the mill by staying to talk to Billy. Her friend, Carrie Pipperidge, is encouraged to see that the shy, retiring Julie is at last interested in a man, and feels that she can now confide her love for Enoch Snow, a fisherman with big ideas for expanding his business.

Billy and Julie marry and settle down with Julie's cousin, Nettie Fowler, who has a Spa on the waterfront. Out of work and restless Billy makes friends with the disreputable Jigger Craigin, who is out to get money by whatever means are necessary. He formulates a plan to rob Mr. Bascombe when he comes down to the deserted quay to pay the Captain of one of his ships — all this under cover of darkness during the clambake which is held every year on the island.

Julie tells Billy that she is to have a child. In his soliloquy on the forthcoming child Billy realises that if he falls in with Jigger's plans he may indeed, have enough money to look after Julie and the child properly.

At the Clambake, Jigger makes overtures to the niaive Carrie. They are caught by Enoch Snow and this leads to a break in their combined happiness.

The robbery misfires and in attempting to get away Billy slips and falls onto his knife, the party returns from the Clambake, and Billy dies in Julie's arms. While Julie and Nettie kneel by the body, the Heavenly Friend comes and takes Billy to the backyard of Heaven. He has not done enough good in his life to be allowed to enter Heaven other than by the back door, and the Starkeeper tells Billy that if he left anything unfinished he can return to earth for one day, and perhaps in this way redeem himself.

Julie catches a glimpse of Billy when he returns to earth and talks to Louise, now 15, who refuses the star he has brought her. At the Graduation Day ceremony Billy manages at last to whisper words of encouragement to Louise which makes her feel one with her fellows, and gives her a new understanding of her Mother. Billy crosses to Julie and says "know that I loved you", the Heavenly Friend beckons him away, and Julie is happy at last in the knowledge of Billy's love.











Determination and hard work have been the key factors in **DON GREGORY's** success over 25 years in the theatre, during which he has gained experience in Revue, Cabaret, Plays, Pantomome and Musicals in both acting and directing. 'Treading the boards' has provided him with a long list of credits to his name, playing roles such as Emile de Becque in 'South Pacific', Professor Higgins in 'My Fair Lady', Tevye in 'Fiddler on the Roof' and the King in 'King and I'. He is at present devoting more time to directing and is particularly delighted to return to the talented and friendly Ramsgate Operatic Society with the ever popular Rodgers and Hammerstein hit 'Carousel'.

MARJORIE CORDEN, our choreographer is no stranger to the Ramsgate Stage. Under her maiden name Marjorie Hall, she and her team of dancers appeared regularly in Summer Season Shows at the Pavillion. The West Cliff Theatre and here at the Granville. As a teenager, then a pupil at St Georges School, Ramsgate she won a scholarship to the Royal Acadamy of Dancing where she studied Classical Ballet. Marjorie has appeared in numerous musicals playing such roles as Nellie Forbush in 'South Pacific', Carrie in 'Carousel', Lucille in 'No No Nannette' and Hodel in 'Fiddler' to name but a few. Since joining the R.A.O.S she has played Ado Annie in 'Oklahoma' and Sarah in 'Guys and Dolls'. Although a choreographer with many years experience this is the first show she has choreographed for our Society.





Although he now lives fifty miles away ROBERT WEAVER needed no persuading to link up once again with Ramsgate Operatic Society. "They are such a friendly, responsive group that I just can't stay away", says Rob, "and I love performing in the Granville Theatre". Through previous productions for us in 'Guys and Dolls', 'The Sound of his Music — An evening with Richard Rodgers', and 'Fiddler on the Roof', Rob has developed a reputation of controlling a quality Orchestra which principal singers don't need to fight against to be heard. Since moving to Kent from Stoke-on-Trent in 1978, Rob has played principal roles with us in 'Orpheus in the Underworld', 'The Mikado', 'The Gondoliers', 'Cowardy Custard' and Oklahoma before 'retiring' to take up the baton.

Ramsgate Amateur Operatic Society 1961 - 1986

Twenty five years ago a group of local Schoolteachers formed a Society with the object of performing the works of Gilbert and Sullivan.

The first ever production by the Ramsgate Amateur Operatic Society was 'The Mikado' performed in May 1961 here at the Granville Theatre. This was followed with productions of 'The Gondoliers', 'Pirates of Penzance', 'Iolanthe, 'Trial by Jury', 'HMS Pinafore' plus many more of the G & S favourities.

Under the guidance of John Hawes, our first chairman, the society expanded and branched out to perform the works of other composers such as Edward Germain's 'Merrie England', Offenbachs 'La Vie-Parisienne' and 'The Merry Widow' by Franz Lehar.

In 1974 the Society had increased in numbers and newer members were keen to try Musical Comedy and so 'The Desert Song' was performed with the producer of tonights show — Don Gregory cast as the Red Shadow. This was followed by 'My Fair Lady', 'Bless the Bride', 'Orpheus in the Underworld' to name but a few.

Many people have given much of their time and effort into the success of this Society — Producers, Musical Directors, Choreographers, Committee members — it is impossible to mention everyone, however one story should be told to show the dedication of one member — James Gillespie, a dedicated student of Gilbert & Sullivan. It was decided that the Society should stage 'The Mountebanks'. However the music for this operetta was unobtainable, James spent four years tracking down a score to Australia. At his own expense, James flew out there and returned with 700 pages of score for this little known work.

In recent years the RAOS has become very much a family affair—one big happy family, members come from all works of life, Schoolchildren, Students, Teachers, Bricklayers, Solicitors, Estate Agents all brought together with one aim—to bring to the stage Musicals and Operettas for you the audience to enjoy with them.

This year, our Silver Jubilee Year, we present, perhaps with a little self-indulgence, two shows which we have found extremely popular with Society members and the Public. 'Carousel', which is probably Rodgers an Hammerstein's finest musical and later this year Gilbert & Sullivan's 'Yeoman of the Guard'. We hope you enjoy tonights performance. You can be assured that the cast, having lived and slept 'Carousel' for the past weeks will be doing their utmost to make you laugh, bring a lump to your throat but most of all, make you enjoy yourselves. If you feel like singing along with the cast — please do.


