



The Directors Thought's

Why Pirates in the 21st Century?

For me, one of the delights of the Savoy Operas is their omni directional humour: as if to say, (as Jack Point did in The Yeomen of the Guard), 'For look you, there is humour in all things'.

Of all the compliments paid to the Gilbert and Sullivan Operettas my favourite is probably 'their humour is as relevant now as it was when they were written'.

Since 1879, when The Pirates of Penzance was first produced, attitudes have changed, humour is now rarely subtle or clever. Satire that you have to think about has been replaced by quick one-liners usually delivered with a liberal sprinkling of expletives!

The concept of a group of Peers going wrong and becoming Pirates, a 70+ year old Major General acting as father to a dozen or more female 'Wards in Chancery', and a Police force made up of cowardly buffoons, is a difficult one to grasp for modern youth!

What then would happen if we kept the music and the satirical approach of Gilbert and Sullivan, but altered the story line slightly to fit in with the 21st century?

Our answer is what you are about to see; we hope you enjoy the production.....

A group of out of work Shakespearean actors set up a school: The Acting School for Boys Only (ASBO), but it is not a success, attracting only three pupils. One of these is Frederic, the son of a wealthy businessman.


In order to augment their income, the actors turn to crime forming a gang; **The Penzance Pirates**. This also is not a success, as they refuse to rob orphans and word gets about!

Frederic determines to destroy the gang as soon as his apprenticeship is over, but he meets and falls in love with Mabel, the daughter of a Major General. The Major General and his four daughters, along with the local Ramblers group, are captured by the gang, and in order to escape their clutches the Major General tells a lie, saying that he is an orphan!

On discovering this lie, the Penzance Pirates determine to seek revenge and set out to kill the Major General and his daughters but Frederic has enlisted the aid of the local police sergeant and his squad of policewomen. After the ensuing battle, the truth is revealed and, as ever with Gilbert and Sullivan, all ends happily!

IAN ULRICH Director

Ian has been a regular performer with R.O.S for many years and has frequently taken on leading roles. Among his favourites are Alfred P. More recently, he has taken on the mantle of director (The Pirates of Penzance, HMS Pinafore, Carmen and Sorcerer), a role he has been happy to repeat with this 21st Century production of The Pirates of Penzance.

ROBERT DRYWOOD Musical Director

Bob was weaned on G and S in his grammar school in Rochester as a pupil. *The Sorcerer* was his third show after *Mikado* and *Iolanthe*. By then he was aged 14. "That's too many years ago to confess," he says. He has over 60 years experience as an amateur performer and 35 plus years of that time as a musical director. He is proud of his 60 years long semi medal awarded to him by NODA in 2008. He is also a Council member of NODA (National Operatic and Dramatic Association).

Sarah Davies Choreographer

Sarah started dancing at the young age of three and then went on to train in Ballet, Modern and Tap at Susan Town's Academy of Dancing in Northfleet, Kent. She gave up dancing at 18 and she wishes she carried it on as a career now. Although she loves to sing and act her passion is dancing. This is the second time Sarah has choreographed a show, the first one was for R.O.S' production of *HMS Pinafore* which was held at the Granville Theatre, Ramsgate in November 2007.

Tony Matthews

The Major General is a welcome return to the stage as a principal for Tony. His leading roles have included Tony (*The Boyfriend*), Nanki-Poo (*The Mikado*), Don Basilio (*The Marriage of Figaro*), Barinkay (*The Gipsy Baron*), Orpheus (*Orpheus in the Underworld*), Perchik (*Fiddler on the Roof*), and Luiz (*The Gondoliers*); but, you are just as likely to see him in the chorus!

Having just finished his role as Hinessie (the Pyjama game) with C.O.S he played Zuniga (Carmen) and is involved with plays and musicals. David joined R.O.S as member of the stage crew for Anything Goes. Then was tempted to the stage by Carmen, followed by The Sorcerer & Trial by Jury and has most recently played the Barman in Calamity Jane.

Nathan Drake

Nathan already has a long list of credits to his name. Leading roles include Romeo (*Romeo and Juliet*), Enjolras (*Les Misérables*), and John Utterson (*Jekyll & Hyde*). His first show with ROS was as the Boatswain (*HMS Pinafore*) in 2007 and he was The Defendant (*Trial by Jury*) last year he played Lieut, Danny Gilmartin in Calamity Jane.

Mike Kendrick

Mike has been a member of R.O.S since 1991, both as principal and as a member of the chorus. His favourite roles include Higgins (*My Fair Lady*) and in our previous production of *Pirates of Penzance* as the Major General. Mike is equally enjoys singing in the chorus. Erin Taylor







