

This is a very special occasion for the Ramsgate Amateur Operatic Society because as many of you will know this is the first time that the Society has performed at the Theatre Royal and indeed it is the first time that an amateur Society has ever performed at the Theatre Royal. For this honour we are indebted to the Castle Trust who in their work of furthering the arts in this area have given us so much help and support in enabling us to stage this production.

The Castle Trust is a registered charity and joint owner, with the Margate Theatre Royal Trust, of this lovely old theatre and have taken on the tremendous task of refurbishing it. Already much has been done but more remains to be done and we hope you will support the trust in its efforts to make the theatre come alive and flourish once again. We thank them for the opportunity to be here and we thank you for coming along and hope that you have an enjoyable evening

May 28th 1878, the launching of HMS Pinafore created a sensation. W.H.Smith, the publisher who had recently been appointed First Lord of the Admiralty by the Prime Minister, Disraeli, was quite blatantly ridiculed and satirised. Within three days in the USA the show was a great success - hundreds were turned away from the box office and in three weeks, five New York theatres were

staging the opera simultaneously.

Act I opens with a lively chorus on the quarter deck. Little Buttercup (Mrs Cripps) appears selling her wares and although she seems 'round and rosy', she does hide 'a dark secret'. Dick Deadeye comes forward, ugly, deformed, and exactly the opposite of Ralph Rackstraw-'the smartest lad in all the fleet'. Ralph harbours a secret, his hopeless love for Josephine the Captains daughter. Captain Corcoran in spite of being 'loved' by all his crew, is sad because his daughter is reluctant to marry Sir Joseph Porter KCB, First Lord of the Admiralty. She swears that she will never disclose her love for a common sailor. Sir Joseph comes aboard, accompanied as always by admiring Sisters, Cousins and Aunts. He sings of his rise from Office Boy to his present exalted position and tells Captain Corcoran to be polite to his crew, since 'a British sailor is any man's equal'. Whilst he and the Captain withdraw to discuss their plans for Josephine, Ralph declares his love to Josephine who rejects him. But as Ralph threatens suicide, she cannot restrain her true feelings and an elopement is planned.

Act II Night has fallen - Captain Corcoran sings sadly of his daughters reluctance to marry Sir Joseph. Buttercup sympathises, the Captain, grateful, maintains that any relationship between them is impossible because of the discrepancy in their stations in life. Yet Buttercup claims knowledge which would change the situation. Sir Joseph complains of Josephine's attitude, and the Captain suggests that she is dazzled by his rank. Sir Joseph assures her that "Love levels all ranks". She immediately seizes on the statement and decides to marry Ralph secretly. Deadeye however reveals their plans to the Captain who intercepts them but is dismissed by Sir Joseph for swearing. Ralph is taken to the dungeons but when Buttercup reveals her secret all is resolved.

The opera is brought to a happy ending by the wit and humour of Gilbert's libretto coupled with the inventive and melodic genius of Sullivan's score. The curtain, we hope, will fall on a smiling company and a smiling audience.
