THE STORY

ACT ONE

This show is one of the many based on the novel 'La Dame Aux Camélias' by Alexandre Dumas, fils; it is set in a dark time in French history, a time of collaboration and corruption, with some businessmen making fortunes while the rest of the population is starving. Marguerite is a privileged courtesan doing well out of the Nazi occupation shielded from the harsher realities of life.

From the opening, the show is told in flashback and we go back to the beginning of the story and Marguerite's apartment where she is celebrating her 40th birthday with her collaborator friends, Georges her former agent and Otto, the powerful German general with whom she is living. A group of musicians has been hired to entertain them and Marguerite is persuaded to sing 'China Doll', which had been her only hit song before she turned to a life of prostitution.

Bombs start to fall and everyone, except Marguerite and Armand the young jazz piano player, take cover in the cellar. He has long admired her from afar and when the bombs explode, shattering the windows, she falls into his arms; they kiss, a passion which neither can control is born and they begin a secret and dangerous affair.

Meanwhile Armand's sister Annette and her lover Lucien are planning to flee Paris because he is a Jew and the Germans have found out about him, he is to go first and Annette, who works for the resistance, will follow when she has completed one more job for them.

ACT TWO

As the affair continues Armand becomes increasingly unhappy that he sees so little of Marguerite and, after a bitter quarrel, she agrees to leave Paris with him. She returns to her apartment to collect her papers and money.

Annette learns that her brother Armand is in danger because Otto knows of his affair with Marguerite so she goes to warn him, but is caught carrying the case of German maps and papers that she was due to deliver for the resistance.

Marguerite returns to her apartment to find Otto there reading the letters she has sent to Armand, Annette is brought in bloodied and beaten and Otto shows Marguerite the warrant for Armand's arrest. Marguerite pleads with Otto and he makes a deal with her that she will write to Armand saying that she will never see him again and then he will tear up the arrest warrant and give orders that Annette will receive no further 'interrogation'.


Following events at the New Year's Eve party, which Otto forces Marguerite to attend, Marguerite is rejected by her former friends who have turned with the political tide and shun her as a collaborator.

The song 'Day by Day', sung by a chorus of collaborators, is repeated four times to reveal their self-seeking, opportunistic shift from collaborators to fake heroics and patriotism as France is liberated.

And so we return to the beginning.


