
COME AND JOIN US!

Carmen - The Musical

Georges Bizet's masterpiece has been re-crafted from the famous opera sung in French, into an exciting new musical in English. Yet it still retains most of the ravishing original score.


Set in 19th century Seville, *Carmen the Musical* tells the tale of a captivating gypsy woman, Carmen, who by day is found 'rolling cigars on her naked thighs' at the local factory, and at night diverting the attention of customs men for her smuggler friends at the mountain border pass. Her seductive power has a profound effect on factory women, townsfolk and the soldiers stationed at the barracks.


A young corporal, Don Jose, is one of many to fall under her spell. Instantly smitten, he rejects his former life, hurting his lovely girlfriend Michaela and breaking his mother's heart in the process. Jose's adoration soon becomes an obsession and, having deserted the army, he follows Carmen and the gypsy smugglers into the hills. When Carmen's affection turns to Escamillo, the dashing bullfighter from Grenada, Jose's jealousy erupts into violence and the gypsy tarot predictions come true.



Georges Bizet based *Carmen* on a story by Mérimée. A Spanish gypsy opera, its success was not immediate and the composer died three months after its first performance in March 1875. It was first performed in London at Her Majesty's Theatre in June 1878.





IAN ULRICH

DIRECTOR

Ian has been a regular performer with ROS for many years and has frequently taken on leading roles. Among his favourites are Alfred P. Doolittle (*My Fair Lady*), Lord Mountararat (*Iolanthe*), and Sir Joseph Porter (*H.M.S. Pinafore*). More recently, he has taken on the mantle of director (*The Pirates of Penzance* and *HMS Pinafore*), a role he has been happy to repeat with this production of *Carmen The Musical*.

KEITH HENDERSON MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Born in London, Keith emigrated with his parents as a 'ten-pound-pom', undertaking his musical education at the Sydney Conservatorium where his composing and conducting talents were encouraged. His works feature in the Australian examination syllabus. He returned to the UK in 1982 and worked for the BBC and the main London music publishing houses before returning to teaching. In January he becomes Director of Music at Dane Court Grammar School.

TARA GORE

CHOREOGRAPHER

Tara has been dancing for 25 years and attended professional dance college "The Centre". She set up the dance school "Stargazers" in 2000. Tara has choreographed many shows in the local area, including productions of *Godspell, Joseph, Annie, Bugsy Malone, Return to the Forbidden Planet, Honk, Romeo and Juliet,* and for Regency Productions: *Rock Upon a Time, High School Musical* and *Fame*. This is her second show with ROS after *Anything Goes* in May of this year.

JODIE KILTY (CARMEN)

Jodie returns to ROS after her recent success as Eliza Doolittle in Canterbury's My Fair Lady. Her leading roles include Hope (Anything Goes), Mabel (Pirates of Penzance) and Josephine (HMS Pinafore). She has also directed Carousel, Me and My Girl, and Guys and Dolls.

CHRIS WIMHURST (DON JOSE)

This is Chris's first show with ROS. He has sung in numerous choirs and currently performs as a singer and keyboard player with the local rock band *Film Club*. He also co-produced and wrote the score for the film *Donovan Slacks* – a far cry from his day job as a finance officer!

IAIN KILTY (ESCAMILLO)

Iain has appeared in many ROS shows but is probably best remembered as a very athletic Pirate King in *The Pirates of Penzance*, and as the repulsive, yet popular, Dick Deadeye in *H.M.S. Pinafore* last year. In his spare time he has the enviable task of being Chairman of the Society.

TASMIN FIELD (MICAELA)

Tasmin has been performing since the age of 4. She has played many roles in plays and musicals including, Molly in *Annie* and Narrator in *Joseph*. She has also sung with local choirs, and teaches music at Dane Court Grammar School.

ERIN TAYLOR (FRASQUITA)

Erin joined ROS as a member of the chorus for *Die Fledermaus* and has since taken on a number of leading roles. These include Jenny Diver (*Beggars Opera*), Sarah Brown (*Guys and Dolls*) and Reno Sweeny (*Anything Goes*).

SAM GRANT (MERCEDES)

Sam rejoined the society in 2001 after a long break of fifteen years. Her principal roles include; Sally Smith in *Me and my Girl* and Carrie Snow in *Carousel*. She will be trying her hand at directing for the first time with *Trial by Jury* next May.
