



Originally presented at the Cambridge Theatre. London, in March 1963 where it ran for 677 performances. Half a Sixpence was based on H.G. Wells' novel "Kipps" and the musical version was written specifically for Tommy Steele.

Wells, a Fabian socialist was ever mindful of the need for social reform in the class conscious days of the England of the early 1900's and in a restless hurry to see it carried out. "Kipps" crystallised his ideas in this respect and acquired the status of a

20th century classic.

Young Arthur Kipps, a lovable simple soul is a live in apprentice to a penny-pinching, slave driving Draper in Folkestone where his dreams of ultimate security and marriage to his working class girlfriend, Ann Pornick, sister of one of his workmates. to whom he gives half of a sixpenny piece as a love token.

Unexpectedly he inherits a fortune from his previously unknown relations and falls prev to the snobbish but hard up Walsingham family in the person of their daughter Helen at whose evening wood-working class his employer Shalford obliges him to attend.

Helen tries to groom him to enter local society and matters come to a head when he is introduced as Helen's fiancé at a social occasion at which Ann has been employed as a servant. She throws him back her half a sixpence and Kipps realises that the shallow, grasping Walsingham lifestyle is not for him when the spoiled young William Walsingham embezzles his recently acquired fortune.

Kipps returns to his faithful Ann and sets up in business at his own level - she accepts his half a sixpence once more and together they face a comfortable future.

Surprisingly, "Half-a-sixpence" despite a 100% English story and background was presented successfully at the 'Broadhurst Theatre' New York in 1965, still with Tommy Steele in the title role, where it ran for 512 performances - this at a time when the all American musical was well nigh impreanable in the USA.

The film version was produced in 1967.
