I have had the privilege of being Chairman for the past 12 years, during which time there have been



Kiss Me Kate - The Story

he show begins at Ford's Theatre Baltimore on the opening night of a musical version of Shakespeare's The Taming of the Shrew. The director and leading man Fred Graham is playing opposite his ex-wife, the movie star Lilli Vanessi who resents the attention Fred is giving to Lois Lane, an attractive cabaret performer who has recently joined the company. Lilli's maid Hattie and the rest of the compnay are used to the fueding between Fred and Lilli and tonight is just 'Another Op'nin, Another Show'. Lois is concerned about her boyfriend Bill Calhoun because she does not want him to mess up their chance of success in the real theatre. 'Why can't you behave'. However, Bill has been gambling and has signed Fred Graham's name on an I.O.U for \$10,000.

Meanwhile, in her dressing room, Lilli talks on the telephone to her new fiancée Harrison Howell, a wealthy politician who has backed the show for \$200,000. She and Fred are at loggerheads again and although they still care for each other, neither will admit it. However, they start to reminisce and remember when they were first married and in the chorus of a second rate operetta in which there was a waltz entitled 'Wunderbar'.

Two gunmen arrive to collect the \$10,000 on the I.O.U. which they believe Fred Graham has signed. Meanwhile Lilli has received a bouquet of flowers which she assumes to have come from Fred and she privately admits that she still loves him with the song 'So in Love'. In fact the flowers were meant for Lois but Lilli does not read the card that came with them.

The play within the play begins with Katherine (Lilli), Petruchio (Fred), Bianca (Lois) and Lucentio (Bill) together with the chorus singing 'We open in Venice', describing their itinerary around

Italy. Bianca, the younger daughter of wealthy Baptista Minola is persued by several suitors but she cannot marry before her older sister Katherine. Petruchio declares that 'I've come to wive it wealthily in Padua' and decides to woo Katherine inspite of her reputation as a shrew. Katherine declares that 'I hate men' and Petruchio tries to woo her with the song 'Were thine the special face'. It is at this point that Lilli, playing the part of Katherine, finds the card which Fred had written to Lois and she uses the action of the play to show her own jealous anger with Fred. The argument continues off stage and Lilli announces that she is walking out of the show. The two gunmen return and Fred admits to signing the I.O.U. but explains that he cannot honour it if Lilli quits and the show is forced to close. The gunmen therefore 'persuade' Lilli to stay and Act I ends with the title song 'Kiss Me Kate'.

During the interval the actors try to escape the heat of the theatre. 'It's too darn hot'. Back on stage and now married to Katherine, Petruchio longs for the women in his past and asks 'Where is the life that late I led?' Harrison Howell arrives in answer to a call from Lilli but is recognised by Lois, whom he has met before. Bill overhears their conversation and becomes jealous but Lois assures him that I'm 'Always true to you darlin' in my fashion'.

The two gunmen declare that their boss has been 'bumped off', so the I.O.U. is no longer binding and Lilli is free to leave. They take a wrong turning on the way out of the theatre and find themselves on stage in front of the curtain where they urge everyone to 'Brush up your Shakespeare'.

The curtain opens for the final scene in which everyone is celebrating the wedding of Lucentio and Bianca. Lilli, realising that she cannot leave the only life she knows, returns and, as Katherine, admits 'I'm ashamed that women are so simple', Lilli/Kate and Fred/Petruchio are finally reconciled.


